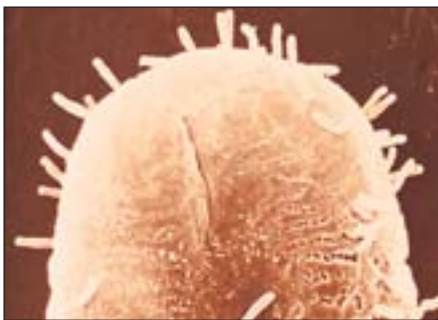




Information about misclassified cell lines is currently accumulating. However, the problem seems to seep very slowly through the scientific community (p. 20)
